Derbyshire Successes

Derbyshire made a very strong showing at the British Championships, with many County records being broken. Of particular note are the Women's 50m Freestyle Open Record taken by Sophie Yendell of Derby Excel in 25.53: the previous record having stood since 2015. Sophie already holds and has lowered, the 50m Butterfly open record to 26.16

George Whittle, also from Derby Excel, joins his brother Jacob as a Derbyshire record holder, taking the 100m Junior Backstroke record with a time of 58.45s

Lydia Cordle from Repton was the youngest competitor at the British Championships and managed to qualify for a final.

Lewis Burras from Repton took both the Men's open 50m and 100m Freestyle records in 27.19 and 47.99 respectively. Lewis gained selection to the World Championships in Fukuoka, Japan, joining Jacob Whittle and Abbie Wood as Derbyshire's representatives - congratulations to all of them on their selection.

Are you interested in becoming an official?

Competitions are vital for our sport but we can't run without officials!

If you're 14 or over our clubs and counties need people like you to help by training to be an official.

What do I get out of it?

- No spectator fee and the best view in the house!
- Mileage*
- Free lunch! *
- Refreshments We'll keep your drinks bottle filled and there's usually a generous helping of sweets or biscuits on offer!
- Helping your club, county or region to keep running events for swimmers.
- A great time! We volunteers are a friendly bunch and you certainly won't get bored.

How can I get started?

There are two routes to choose from to become an official: you can start by training to be a Timekeeper, or, if you're 15 or over you could choose to go straight to Judge 1 training. The Timekeeping course is a 60-90-minute e-learning course, followed by a practical timekeeping session that can be completed at an event.

The Judge 1 course is a 6-8 hour e-learning course, after which you will be sent your training logbook and further details for your practical assessment.

We would also consider someone who is a level 1 working towards level 2.



Merger of City of Derby Swimming Club and Derventio Excel Swim Squad

On 9th April, the merger of two Derby based swimming clubs, City of Derby Swimming Club and Derventio Excel Swim Squad was finalised. Both clubs were training at the new Moorways Sports Village in Derby, and the merger sees the collective skills and resources of both clubs combining to form a strong, stable club in Derby. This has taken 15 months of discussions and meetings, with input from Swim England representatives. The club is set up as a CIO (Charitable Incorporated Organisation) registered with the Charity Commission, with a board of Trustees. Derby Excel will be led by Head Coach John Adye, who will oversee the swimming programme. Babs Ingram is the Chair, Nisha Bains is the Treasurer, and Pippa Hibbs is the Secretary.

The merger will ensure continuity of training for the swimmers, whatever their level and ability - from novices coming out of the learn to swim programme, right up to those representing GB nationally, such as current GB record holder Imogen Clark. Derby Excel will offer a performance pathway for swimmers in the south of Derbyshire, who join the performance squads but retain membership of their home (pathway) club, with a Memorandum of Understanding between the clubs to clarify the relationship. The aim is to establish strong links between the pathways clubs and Derby Excel, improving and inspiring swimmers across these clubs. There are currently 2000 swimmers enrolled in Moorways Learn to Swim programme, and when they learn to swim there, they can continue their swimming with Derby Excel in the junior squads. Repton Swimming - British Championships report:

Repton Swimming have just finished competing at the inaugural British Swimming Championships 2023, which is no doubt the pinnacle event of swimming in Great Britain. The championships were held at the Ponds Forge International Centre in Sheffield, between 4th-9th April 2023.

In recent years this event has had Junior Qualifying Times, but this year it was just an Open Qualifying process that our young swimmers had to achieve. We are proud to say that we had a total 20 swimmers qualify for the Championships, of which 14 were Repton School pupils, 1 is part of Repton Swimming Club and 5 are overseas distance members who represent Repton Swimming as their home club.

Huge progressions have been made from our swimmers and this resulted in a total of 31 finals, with 30 event personal bests throughout the meet.

- Laurie Devine got a Consideration Time (50m Free) for Great Britain for the European Junior Championships

- Laurie Devine 3 Consideration Times for Scotland for the Commonwealth Youth Games
- Holly Marshall got a Consideration Time for Wales for the Commonwealth Youth Games
- Hannah Bowley, Lucy Hitchin, Holly Robinson, Hettie D'Ammassa all got CT's for England for the Commonwealth Youth Games
- Lewis Burras (overseas distance member) has made the Great Britain Team for the World Championships after winning the 100m Free

Long Eaton Regional Championships Success

Long Eaton Swimming Club had a great first weekend at the East Midlands regional championships, with 7 swimmers from the home programme competing, and a further 5 LESC members swimming under a pathway club.

Of the home programme swimmers, 3 qualified for finals and our youngest competitors, Tom Pope (200 fly) and Joseph Heather (50 back) both came home with silver medals!

Joseph also broke the clubs all time record for 11yrs boys with his swim in the 50 back final.

Two more silver medals were won by our pathway swimmers Finlay Bird and Alex Harrand in the 800 freestyle, and Matilda Hase improved on her own all time club record for 16yrs girls 1500 freestyle.
